- 191 Prang's store, one of the oldest buildings in Unionville, central part of hickory logs chinked with stone. Formerly Chandler's other store and also Chamber's grocery.
- 192 Prang's home
- 193 The Cottage and Bonnie's Beauty Salon.
- 194 Maple Cottage, now Alfred Seal Thorn's. Built 1802 by Dr. Stebbins. In 1807 Dr. Seal came to practise with him. House has been in Seal family since then. Office a separate building still has human skeleton in attic. Home of J. Henry Marshall, then of Allen Pierce.

- 196 David Pyle's residence. Undertaker and cabinet maker (made coffins too).
- 197 Jan's Cleaning Co.
- 198 Early telephone exchange of Elizabeth Wickersham.
- 199 George Love, builder. Built many of Unionville's frame homes.
- 200 Unionville's blacksmith and wheelwright shop
- 201 Chalfont Cabinet Works, later Walter and Dave Pyle's cabinet shop.
- 202 Webb's—shoemaker
- 203 Sale barn
- 204 Union Hotel, Unionville Peoples Bank, now apartments.
- 205 Cross Keys Inn. Oyster bar in basement. Built by John Jackson in 1783. Called Old Union Hotel.
- 206 Tin Smith shop of Willis Lollar, and later John Frank Shaw's. Stayed open until midnight Saturday nights.
- 207 Unionville Saddle Shop, formerly James Gault Grocery.
- 208 Unionville Post Office now. Originally post office was in Prang's store.
- 209 Art Gallery
- 210 Unionville Hall (now Chromalytics).
- 211 Former library (second). Original across from Unionville Hall.
- 212 Acadia. Built by Dr. Swayne in 1720 (great-grandfather of William Marshall Swayne, sculptor, who did busts of Washington and Lincoln.)
- 213 The Village of Longwood, formerly known as Anvil.
